



How to care for your new Jellyfish!

Congratulations on the arrival of your new jellyfish! To ensure the health and survival of your jellyfish there are a few initial steps you must follow to warm them to their new homes.

Before Your Jellyfish Arrive

- Ensure you have a suitable jellyfish-friendly tank which has been filled with Salted Reverse Osmosis (RO) Water - this is widely available from most aquatic shops - with 34 parts per thousand salinity / 1.025 Specific Gravity
- Tap water is not acceptable for the keeping of jellyfish!

Introducing Your Jellyfish To The Tank

1. Check the tank's water movement is functioning (you can adjust later if needed). Water flow is vital for the health and wellbeing of jellyfish as many species need this flow in order to move through the water.
2. Settle them in: Float the shipping bag in your tank for 30 minutes to allow the jellies to adjust to the temperature.
3. Release your jellyfish into the tank, taking care not to expose the jellyfish to the air.

Tip: Cut away the top of the shipping bag to allow for a greater area for jellies to swim through and into the tank.

Keep your Jellyfish at these conditions to extend their lifetime:

Temperature: 16-21 Centigrade
Salinity: 34-35ppt / 1.025 SG
pH: 8.1-8.4
Ammonia: 0
Nitrates: 0-0.2

Remember those 10% water changes every 7-10 days to keep these parameters!
Remember to remove any uneaten food from the tank daily, in order to prevent ammonia rates rising!

Feeding

Jellyfish need feeding once or twice a day. Live food is best, but dried food is a good alternative.

Tip: Less is more! Jellies will only eat as much as they can in 15 minutes!

Arrive Alive Guarantee

Please note that we cannot accept photo/video of jellies in the tank! Make sure to photo them in their shipping bags if there are any issues! Not sure what they should look like? Photo them and drop us an email, we can advise.

Tip: Jellies will often be slow or even motionless upon arrival, this doesn't mean they are dead! Follow the 'Introducing Your Jellyfish to the Tank' steps and within a few hours you should see them begin to pulse.
